





#### MaineCare Coverage for Donor Breast Milk

LD85 An Act Concerning MaineCare Coverage for Donor Breast Milk would require the Maine Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) to reimburse the costs of donor breast milk for infants who are on MaineCare and who have certain itions. This reimbursement would mean that there would be no cost to e families to access donor breast milk for their babies. The bill received unanimous support in the Health and Human Services (HHS) Committee and is expected to receive a vote in the full Maine House and Senate in the next month. LD85 An Act Concerning MaineCare. 
What is your age? 62 responses



In your interactions with the Maine State Breastfeeding Coalition, would you consider yourself a...




How do you like to describe your sexual identity or sexual orientation? Select all that apply. 62 responses





#### In which region do you live/work?






We have met 3 times so far and have a monthly, standing meeting.




